## By Laws

(Adopted October 13, 1980)

- The directors of this society may consist of 24 in number; five to consist of the president, vice president, secretary, financial secretary, and treasurer, to be elected annually as provided by law (six were elected at the first election following the adoption of the article of association; two for one year, two for two years, and two for three years). Directors are now elected for three years.
- The president shall preside at meetings.
- The secretary shall keep a true report of the proceedings of the society and conduct all correspondence.
- The treasurer shall keep all monies of the society and hold the same subject to the order of the society and keep books with accounts of receipts and expenses.
- The directors shall fix the dates of the annual fair and shall have the appointing of judges and assist the president, secretary, and treasurer in making the prize list and other duties as may be required.
- The Board of Directors shall further have the power to make rules governing the annual fair.
- Non-exhibitor member is \$5.00 per year.
- No classes shall be added to the open class on the day of the fair.
- The Board of Directors shall have the power to fix the compensation of the officers for services rendered.
- The By-Laws can be amended or changed only by a majority vote of all members present at the annual meeting.
- A majority of the elected directors shall constitute a quorum of the Board of Directors.
- The secretary shall call a meeting of the directors no later than May 1<sup>st</sup> of each year for the purpose of fixing the date of the annual fair.
- The secretary shall draw all orders on the treasurer.
- The treasurer shall pay all orders signed by the secretary or the president.
- The society will not be responsible for articles or exhibits in the wrong classes and disqualified by the judges or responsible for injuries sustained on the fair grounds at any time, or exhibits lost, stolen, or damaged.
- The annual meeting of the society shall be held on the second Monday of October.
- If at any time the fair closes, the property shall revert back to Raber Township.
- Any director that misses two consecutive meetings without a legitimate reason may be dismissed from the board. A phone call to the secretary will be sufficient excuse.
- No land or buildings are to be given away, sold, or bartered away unless it pertains to By-Law number 17 without board approval.
- Fair Raffle is conducted under rules of the Michigan Gaming Commission.

## Entry Procedures

1. All members, 18 years of age or older, have the opportunity to vote at the annual meeting.
2. Exhibitors must be at least six (6) years old as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year to exhibit in any fair class with the exception of the Pee Wee Class which is 3 to 5 years old only.
3. All exhibitors (including youth) must pay an entry fee of \$2.00 for the first four (4) entries and thereafter a \$.25 (quarter) an entry. This entitles them to one admission ticket at the gate. All livestock will pay \$1.00 per class unless stated otherwise.
4. Gate buttons are needed for admission to the grounds and hall: Adults and Students \$5.00 and Pre-school free. Buttons are valid for the duration of the fair.
5. All stock must be bonafide property of the exhibitors. Ages of livestock date from January 1st. All livestock exhibited must comply with the state laws regarding tests for disease of any kind.
6. Exhibitors of purebred registered stock must show registration certificate as required to the superintendent.
7. All grain, vegetables, flowers, and fruit must be raised on the farm or garden of the exhibitor the year exhibited.
8. All fancy work and other articles, or home manufactured, must be the handiwork of the exhibitor.
9. The secretary will be available at the fairgrounds from 1:00 to 8:00 pm to receive entries on the first day of the fair. All entries must be made on or before that day. The secretary cannot receive any new entries on the morning of the second day, except to make corrections. All exhibits must be in place by 8:00am of the second day (when the judging will start). It is necessary to strictly enforce this rule to avoid confusion. Entry forms may be obtained from the **Secretary, Penny Belinski (Phone# 906-647-2611)**.
10. No exhibitors can enter more than one exhibit in any one section of a class.

## Rules and Regulations

1. All exhibits are to be left in charge of the committee **until 4:00pm Saturday** local time or forfeit the prizes on the exhibit.
2. Any exhibits not entered in its proper class will be disqualified from receiving a prize, and the fair board will not be responsible if exhibits are not entered properly.
3. No exhibit can be entered in more than one class (except special prizes or sweepstakes). Horses may be entered single and also as one of a team in the class in which they are entered. Ponies and light horses may enter in halter and saddle classes by paying an extra fee of \$2.00 for the second class.
4. No exhibitors can enter more than one exhibit in any one section of a class.

### ***Rules and Regulations Continued:***

5. Exhibitors must secure their admission ticket before they can be admitted to the grounds free. Entry receipts are good for only one person.
6. No person will be allowed near the judges during the inspection of the exhibits (except those whose duty it is to wait on the judges).



7. Judging in all classes will begin promptly at 8:00am of the second day. Exhibits placed after that hour will be disqualified. Exhibitors shall place their exhibit during the first day if possible. Watchmen are on guard throughout the night.
8. Any person desiring to rent concessions or stands (i.e. ice cream, hot dogs, lunches, peanut stands, etc.) shall make application to the president of the society or secretary, not later than the first day of the fair. No games of chance or gambling will be allowed on the grounds.
9. The society or any member of the board of directors will not be responsible for lack of funds on hand.
10. If, through adverse circumstances, funds on hand are not enough to pay premiums in full, then each one will be paid pro-rate to the amount of money on hand. Every exhibition is shown under this provision.
11. The society will not assume any responsibility for any accident of any nature which may occur on the premises at any time.
12. Ribbons and rosettes will be awarded for all places as listed for each class unless otherwise specified.
13. If in the opinion of the superintendent and judge the exhibit is not worthy, no premium will be awarded.
14. Only horses paying an entry fee for exhibition, racing, and pulling are to be on the grounds during the days of the fair. Horses are to be ridden on the fairgrounds only when being shown or racing. An exercise area will be designated and may be used only during the exercise hours. This is for the public's safety and will be enforced. Proof of current year's negative Coggins is required for all horses on the fairgrounds. Coggins will be checked upon arrival. No horses are allowed on the grounds before 1pm on Thursday. No horses are allowed in the back ballfield camping area.
15. In the opinion of the superintendent, if any exhibitor does not keep his animal fed and stall cleaned, he will forfeit all prize monies.
16. Canadians pay American money at par on all entries.
17. All campers pay a fee of \$30.00 regardless of length of stay. All adult and student campers will need to purchase gate buttons for \$5 each. Gate buttons give campers admission to the grounds for the duration of the fair.
18. The Stalwart Fair does not drug test 4-H livestock and will have no animals for slaughter.
19. No livestock will be allowed to be unloaded off the trailers until they have been inspected by the department leader and cleared to enter the barn.
20. All livestock must enter between 5 - 8 pm. Paperwork may be filled out earlier but no animals will be unloaded and placed in the barns until 5:00 pm. This includes rabbits, goats, sheep, chickens, beef, & dairy.
21. A formal protest by an exhibitor not satisfied with awarding of premiums may be made, by filing with the directors in writing, stating their cause of complaint within 10 days of the close of the fair. Action will be taken by the protest committee, which consists of the director of that department and the fair officers. If a decision cannot be made the protest will be taken to the fair board. All parties shall be given an opportunity to tell their side before a decision is made. If the exhibitor is not satisfied with the decision, the exhibitor has 45 days from the date that the complaint was filed with the fair to file an appeal with the Department of Agriculture. The department has 60 days to investigate the appeal and issue a report on the findings. A \$25.00 fee is charged to file a complaint with the fair board.

**An exhibitor may file a complaint for any of the following reasons:**

1. Conflict of interest of the judge.
2. Disqualification of an exhibit or exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor, group leader, or superintendent's behavior.
4. Eligibility of the exhibit.

# ***General Rules for Boys & Girls Youth Work (All Departments)***

- ★ Ages for showing are 6 to 19 years of age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year.
- ★ Youth must pay an entry fee of \$2.00 for the first four items and \$.25 (quarter) thereafter. This will entitle entrance at the gate for the entire length of the fair.
- ★ Boys and Girls work is judged on the Danish System.
- ★ All entries must be in by 8:00pm entry day of the fair.
- ★ Livestock may be entered in open class, with the exception of eggs. A separate entry for “A Dozen Eggs” is required for open class.
- ★ Exhibits should be according to project requirements.
- ★ Every entry tag is to have an age written in the upper right hand corner. This will allow each entry to be judged according to age.
- ★ Foods must be canned in standard canning jars. Jars must be clean, have new ring and seal, and must not be larger than one quart in size.
- ★ Baked goods should have a 3”x 5” recipe card along with the entry to be displayed. They must also be enclosed in zip lock bags.
- ★ Horses may be entered in both Youth Department and Open Class by youth age 6 to 19 as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year.
- ★ For classes under educational or demonstration project categories, participants are limited to youth who are 19 years of age or younger by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year.
- ★ Participants 26 years of age or under by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year who has been determined to be eligible for special education services by the local school district may participate in classes under the educational and demonstration projects.
- ★ Separate entry sheets to be used for Youth and Open class entries.
- ★ The cover for the following fair year (Class No. 0169) must include the following:
  - 1) The year of the fair (i.e. “119<sup>th</sup>”).
  - 2) The words “Stalwart Agricultural Fair”.
  - 3) The words “Michigan’s Biggest Little Fair”.
  - 4) Date of the fair (The fair is always the Thursday, Friday, & Saturday after Labor Day).
- ★ The button design for the following fair year (Class No. 0170) must include the following:
  - 1) The year (i.e. “2025”).
  - 2) The words “Stalwart Fair”.

# Youth Livestock Showing Rules

- ★ All youth department dairy animals over 6 months of age must be dehorned.
- ★ Exhibitors must furnish own bedding hay and food.
- ★ All stalls, pens and walkways must be kept clean at all times. On the last day of the fair, stalls and pens must be cleaned and approved by the department leader or premiums will be forfeited.
- ★ Appropriate dress code will be enforced, and you should be dressed neat and tidy with leather or cowboy boots and no hats.
- ★ Any livestock on the fairgrounds must be shown (*exception*: any pre-arranged demonstrations).
- ★ No animals will be allowed to run free on the grounds.
- ★ **Feeding Times:** Animals must be fed before 9:00am each morning and by 7:00pm each evening.
- ★ **Entry Forms:** All exhibitors should pre-register their livestock before the start of the fair (see Youth Livestock Pre-Registration Form on the following page) and must officially register all of their livestock on entry day.
- ★ Ages for showing are the age of the exhibitor on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year. Ages 6 to 19 for showing Sheep and Dairy (ages 6 to 8 must show a Junior Heifer Calf). Ages 8 to 19 for Beef Breeding. Ages 6 to 19 for Poultry, Rabbits, Goats, and Sheep.
- ★ There will be Pee Wee classes for youth 3 to 5 years of age by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the fair year. These classes are: rabbits, goats, poultry, sheep, and costume class. A parent or legal guardian must accompany the youth in the show ring. These classes will be placed but will receive no premiums. All youth will receive a participation ribbon.
- ★ The fair board reserves the right to reject exhibitors from the following years fair due to:
  - 1) Unruly behavior.
  - 2) Failure to cooperate with the Superintendents and Judges.
  - 3) Any other reason the Fair Board determines in its discretion to be inappropriate.
  - 4) All Fair Board decisions are Final.
- ★ **Statement of Animal Care:** The Stalwart Fair is a showplace for animal agriculture for the county. All animals and livestock shown, housed, or displayed shall receive care that is humane, healthful and consistent with accepted practices. Professional veterinary care will be provided at the expense of the owner/exhibitor. Animals experiencing illness or discomfort will be given proper care. Exhibitors must notify the Superintendent if they feel their animal is ill.
- ★ The Fair Management will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to the animal exhibited or for any articles which may be lost or stolen.
- ★ **TB Testing:** All beef, dairy, and goats on the grounds must originate from a herd that has had the required whole herd test. A copy of the test must accompany all animals to the fair. All animals must have an official identification tag in its ear upon arrival.
- ★ All sheep being shown must have an official USDA individual tag in its ear upon arrival.
- ★ **Pullorum Testing:** All poultry except waterfowl, pigeons, and doves must have a negative whole flock Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of the show or be tested individually on the day of entry at the fair.
- ★ Poultry-Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT) vaccinated birds will not be allowed on the fairgrounds.
- ★ The exhibitor must have possession of all breeding stock within 30 days of the start of the fair.
- ★ All cattle being exhibited must be double tied (Halter and Neck Tie).
- ★ All animals are required to stay on the grounds as space allows.
- ★ Barn space is on a first come first serve basis according to the order of pre-registrations received.

## Jackpot Show

- ★ Jackpot class will directly follow the youth beef show.
- ★ Electrical power is limited and wash station is available.
- ★ Jackpot show exhibitors must bring their animals for Thursday night and stay on the grounds as space allows.
- ★ Entry fee must be paid prior to the show or you will not be allowed to show.
- ★ Entry fee is per animal.
- ★ No professional fitters will be allowed.
- ★ Winner will receive a trophy and the pot of money.
- ★ Ages for showing are 8 and up as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.
- ★ All steer calves must be born after January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.
- ★ All steer calves must be fully castrated.
- ★ All steer calves must be free of diseases, runny nose, ringworm, warts, etc.
- ★ All steer calves must have TB tag in ear upon arrival to the fairgrounds.
- ★ No horns over 2 inches.
- ★ No use of any substance that will alter or change the color of the calves hair, hide, or hooves will be allowed.

# STALWART FAIR BBQ PORK CONTEST RULES

Saturday September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Stalwart Fair Grounds

1. Contest will be blind box judging. Please note, the judges will not know whose pork they are judging.
2. Each team must provide and cook two 8 - 9 pound pork shoulder roasts (pork butts) there is no entry fee because teams are supplying the meat.
3. Turn in boxes will be supplied to the teams when they check in upon arrival.
4. All entries must be cooked on site.
5. Turn in is at 4:00 pm at the little red barn. Teams can start cooking any time (all pork must be cooked entirely on site).
6. The workers at the red barn will assign each entry a number by a drawing. The containers will be marked with the number drawn by the contestant, before being taken to the judges table.
7. The contest will be judged for Appearance, Taste, and Tenderness. Scores will range from 1 - 9 with 1 being the worst and 9 being the best. Any box with anything other than what the rules state will be scored as a 1. The judges will have a scoring sheet for each box marked with the number on the box. No one is influenced by how another judge scores the entry. While the scoring process is going on, we ask that the judges not comment until scoring is complete, so opinion is swayed. After the scoring is completed, the individual score sheets for each entry will be added up for a final score.
8. Boxes can be garnished for presentation purposes with either leaf lettuce or parsley. No side dishes are allowed. If you are saucing your entry, the sauces must be applied to the meat, no placing sauce in a separate serving container. The pork in the box must be sliced, pulled or chopped, and/or any combination of the three. Boxes must contain enough pork for three judges to sample.
9. The winner will be announced at 5:00 pm.

*All of the pork cooked during the contest will be sold as pulled pork sandwiches to raise money for the Fair. Tell your families and friends to come and sample the great pork and support a great Fair! Everything needed for the sandwich meal will be provided. The only thing that the teams need to supply is the 2 pork butts and whatever cooking supplies they need and their own cooker. We also ask that each team (after boxes are turned in for judging) pull the remaining pork and put it in an electric roaster to bring to the serving tent for the meal. We ask that a team member stat at the serving tent to serve their entry.*

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It is because of supportive people like you that our fair continues to grow.***

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
